Stations of the Cross

Join us in prayerful meditation of the Stations of the Cross each Friday at 7pm in English or 7:30pm in Spanish, except Good Friday. (Our Good Friday prayer service will be at 3pm.) On Friday, March 5 at 7pm, we will pray a special "Mary's Way of the Cross" which portrays Mary's emotions as she watches her son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, suffer and die on Calvary.

Prayer and renewal

Weekday Mass at 8am in the Chapel, Monday—Thursday, and in the main church on Friday.

Pray the rosary in the Chapel every weekday morning after the 8am Mass, and Wednesdays at 4:30pm.

Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered Saturdays from 4-5pm. Date and times for the parish Lenten evening reconciliation service will be announced in the parish bulletin.

Eucharistic Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is available each Friday from 8:30am until 7pm, closing with Benediction. Consider spending some time each week alone with Jesus to read the Bible, meditate, pray a rosary or engage in any other type of prayerful devotion before Our Lord.
